The programme, encompassing Geriatrics and Paediatrics, was well received - more details in the next issue of Meridian!






#### President's Message



"In May 2008, I completed Advanced Medical Science, the 12-month research component of the Bachelor of Medicine, Surgery and Medical Science degree at the University of Melbourne with Austin Health's Department of Cardiology.

"My study, which examined the screening of depressive disorders in patients with cardiovascular disease, yielded two abstracts to
